Book Sources

No Author -- use editor(s)

Kitchen, Judith, and Mary Paumier Jones, eds. *In Short: A Collection of Brief Creative Nonfiction*. New York: Norton, 1996. Print.

In-text citation: (Kitchen and Jones 15)

Corporate Author – use corporation name

Bank of Boston. *Banks by Remote Control*. Boston: Bank of Boston, 1997. Print.

In-text citation: (Bank of Boston 27)

Unknown Author – begin with title

Alphabetize the entry by the first word of the title other than *A*, *An*, or *The*.

Oxford Essential World Atlas. New York: Oxford UP, 1996. Print.

In-Text Citation: (use a short form of the title or complete title if necessary)

Newspaper Articles

Article in a Daily Newspaper

Knox, Richard A. "Please Don't Dial and Drive, Study Suggests." *Boston Globe* 13 Feb. 1997: A1+. Print.

Unsigned Article in a Newspaper

"Please Don't Dial and Drive, Study Suggests." *Boston Globe* 13 Feb. 1997: A1+. Print.

Other Sources

E-Mail

(Give the author, the subject line in quotation marks, and the word "E-mail" followed by the recipient and the date of the message.)

Schubert, Josephine. "Re: Culture Shock." E-mail to the author. 14 Mar 1998.

Pamphlet

Cite a pamphlet as you would a book.

Personal Unpublished Letter

Begin with the writer's name, and add the phrase "Letter to the author," followed by the date and publication medium. For publication medium use MS for manuscript if the work is written by hand and use TS for typescript if the work is typed.

Cipriani, Karen. Letter to the author. 25 Apr. 1998. TS.

Personal Interview

Begin with the name of the person interviewed, then write "Personal interview," followed by the date.

Meeker, Dolores. Personal interview. 21 Apr. 1998.

Published Interview – add publication medium

Renior, Jean. "Renior at Home: Interview with Jean Renior." *Film Quarterly* 50.1 (1996): 2-8. Print.

Wiesel, Elie. Interview by Ted Koppel. *Nightline*. ABC. WABC, New York. 18 Apr. 2002. Television.

Maps and Charts

Treat maps and charts like anonymous books but add a descriptive label (Maps, Charts).

New York State. Map. Chicago: Rand McNally, 2008. Print.

Japanese Fundamentals. Chart. Hauppauge: Baron, 1992. Print.

Map Cited From the Web

"Maplewood, New Jersey." Map. *Google Maps*. Google, 15 May 2008. Web. 25 May 2008.

Personal Photographs

Description of subject, city. Personal photograph by person who took the photo. Date photo was taken. Format.

Empire State Building, New York. Personal photograph by Mrs. Hendrick. 1 Jan. 09. Print.

Digital Photographs

Empire State Building, New York. Personal photograph by Mrs. Hendrick. 1 Jan. 09. JPEG file.

Photograph in a Museum or Collection

Cite a photograph in a museum or collection as you would a painting, sculpture or other work of art. See **Works of Art**.

Works of Art

Artists name. *Title of work*. Date of composition or N.d. if no date known. Medium of composition. Institution that houses the work, City.

Rembrandt, Harmensz van Rijn. *Aristotle with a Bust of Homer*. 1653. Oil on canvas. Metropolitan Museum of art, New York.

Cartoons or Comic Strip

Artists name. "Title of cartoon or comic if any." Descriptive label. Publication information. Medium of publication.

Karasik, Paul. Cartoon. *New Yorker* 14 Apr.2008: 49.Print. Note: this cartoon has no title.
