Plagiarism Policy

Plagiarism is defined as the act of stealing and passing off as one's own the ideas or words of another, the use of another's production without crediting the source, to present as new and original an idea or product derived from an existing source.
-Merriam Webster's Collegiate Dictionary, 2002

Bishop Grimes Jr./Sr. High School is a faith-centered institution and as such we uphold the virtues and beliefs of the faith. We acknowledge the definition of plagiarism, and so recognize this action as nothing less than stealing and cheating. Both of these actions are contrary to the basic tenants of our faith. Consequently, we treat any incidence of plagiarism with the utmost seriousness.

In recognition of the importance of this matter, Bishop Grimes has developed a cohesive curriculum for each grade level that addresses this issue of plagiarism. Through a series of lessons, students learn how to write research papers citing outside sources as outline in the MLA Handbook. They are also taught what plagiarism is and how to avoid it in their work.

We recognize plagiarism as the following:

- Submitting another student's work, in whole or part, as one's own.
- Inclusion of direction quotations, ideas, or paraphrases for another person's or institution's work without formally acknowledging their work.

To avoid plagiarism:

- Students should use parenthetical references and quotation marks as needed throughout their papers.
- Students should submit a correctly formatted "Works Cited" page with their work when appropriate.
- Under no circumstances should students submit work that is not theirs and claim it as such (i.e. homework, papers, labs, outlines, essays, tests, etc.)

Disciplinary action to be followed if plagiarism occurs:

- 1st Offense: Zero on assignment, notification to the parent/guardian by teacher, and a teacher referral to the administration for possible disciplinary action.
- Repeat Offense: Each repeat offense will be cause for a zero on the particular assignment/assessment by the teacher, a teacher notification to the parent/guardian of the incident, and a teacher referral of the incident to the administration for possible disciplinary action. Repeat offenses by the student could result in a student suspension, a failing grade for the academic quarter, and any other appropriate.
